- Universal screeners given to every Kindergarten, First and Second Grade student
- Each teacher monitors individual student assessments of every student via iReady, DIBELS, and Teacher Observations recorded in Standards Based Report Cards. These results are shared with parents at parent/teacher conferences as well as regular progress update communications.
- <u>ATLAS</u> Summative Assessments are given annually in grades 3 and up. Students are expected to meet the readiness levels of "Exceeding" or "Ready"
- FSD offers Gifted and Talented Enrichment opportunities

## • Student Assessment 5-8:

- iReady Literacy & Math
- STAR Reading and STAR Math-three times per year
- Proficiency and Growth Planning
  - Data is used to develop an instructional plan for every student which includes; iReady literacy and math data; STAR Reading and Math data; smart goals; interventions; etc.
  - Each teacher monitors individual student assessments of every student via iReady, and Teacher Observations recorded in Standard Report cards. These results are shared with parents at parent/teacher conferences as well as regular progress update communications.
  - <u>ATLAS</u> Summative Assessments are given annually in grades 3 and up. Students are expected to meet the readiness levels of "Exceeding" or "Ready"
  - FSD offers Gifted and Talented Enrichment opportunities

## • Student Assessment 9-12:

- <u>ATLAS</u> Summative Assessments- end-of-year state summative assessments for grades 3-10 ELA, 3-8 Math, 3-8 Science, EOC Algebra I, EOC Geometry, and EOC Biology. Students are expected to meet the readiness levels of "Exceeding" or "Ready".
- STAR Reading and IXL Diagnostic testing- three times per year
- Proficiency and Growth Planning
  - Data is used to develop an instructional plan for every student which includes: STAR Reading and IXL data; teacher observations; smart goals; interventions; etc.
  - Each teacher monitors individual student assessments of every student via Renaissance and IXL, and Teacher Observations recorded in Report Cards. These results are shared with parents at

parent/teacher conferences as well as regular progress update communications.
